NEW GUIDED SCHOOL TOURS PRESCHOOL • GRADES K-1 • GRADE 4

In these exciting new field trips, students split their time learning and exploring at the History Center and the Orlando Public Library in programs that align with Florida Standards. Lunch will be scheduled during the tour time to keep students energized and ready to learn!

Safety is our top priority, and we've perfected the art of safely navigating around downtown Orlando. When walking from the History Center to the library (just across the street), students will wear bright yellow safety vests and use a hold-a-ring walking rope to keep groups together. An adult will be placed at the front and back of the group.

All of our new, expanded field trips include:

- A one-hour guided tour of the museum with hands-on artifacts, replicas, and activities
- One hour of guided activities at the Orlando Public Library including story time and rotation of fun lesson activities
- Detailed and customizable tour schedule
- Picnic-style lunch space in Heritage Square Park

Guided tours for preschoolers and Grades K-1 students with a visit to the Orlando Public Library are 2.5 hours long. Cost: \$7 per student (minimum of 10 students). One chaperone is free per 10 students; \$5 per additional chaperone. Teachers are free.

PRESCHOOL

Introduce social studies with an engaging field trip. Developed with preschoolers in mind, this program is packed with imaginary play and hands-on activities that practice motor skills. Your students are bound to have a historic adventure!

NEW GUIDED SCHOOL TOURS GRADE 4 • AVAILABLE IN SPRING 2017

Immerse your students in our state's rich history! This field trip is a perfect complement to the fourth-grade curriculum and provides a unique look at 12,000 years of Florida history. It's a great, affordable alternative to visiting St. Augustine and aligns with Florida Standards.

The program features three onehour segments: a guided tour at the History Center, guided activities at the Orlando Public Library, and a walking tour featuring historic Orlando sites and buildings, led by a trained History Center staff member. PERFECT FOR SUMMER! SELF-GUIDED TOURS

Self-guided tours allow educators and children to set the pace and guide their own experience through the museum.

Self-guided tours are \$5 per student. One chaperone is free per 10 students; \$4 per additional chaperone. Educators are free.

NEW TEACH-IN

The Teach-In program sends History Center staff to teach within individual classrooms. The highlight of the program is the use of popular games and toys as the medium for teaching history. Through exploratory play, students are learning about historical topics and making connections between past and present.

The Teach-In program aligns with Florida Standards and includes a onehour lesson per class. The program is designed to serve one whole grade level and may require multiple dates, depending on the number of classes and academic schedules.

Two program themes are available:

• Native Americans focuses on the Timucuan and Seminoles' way of life and their interaction and exchange with explorers and American settlers. Activities include Legos, building blocks, magnetic shapes, and a take-home craft. Recommended for Grades 2 and 4.



• Florida Statehood focuses on European explorers, countries that have governed Florida, pioneer life, and state animals and symbols. Activities include Legos, Lincoln Logs, Sorry Sliders, and a Spot It! style matching game. Recommended for Grade 4. Cost: \$250 per grade level up to eight classes.



PLAYS AND PUPPET SHOWS

Get students get into the act with our short plays and puppet shows that focus on Central Florida history and encourage audience interaction. Shows are performed by professional actors complete with costumes and props.

THE COW AND HORSE PIONEER PUPPET SHOW

Buckaroo the horse and his bovine friend, Cowabunga, take students back to the early days of pioneers in an interactive show filled with fun and facts about the Florida frontier. **Recommended for pre-K through Grade 1; 30 minutes. Cost: \$150 for up to 125 students.**



HABITAT HULLABALOO PUPPET SHOW

Explore life in the swamp with Chompz the alligator and Bandit the raccoon as they compare survival stories, learn to cooperate, and contend with pesky pioneer Bunk Baxter. **Recommended for pre-K through Grade 1; 30 minutes. Cost: \$150 for up to 125 students**.

Recommended for Grade 3 and up; 30 minutes.

Cost: \$150 for up to 125 students.

CRACKER FAMILY

Pests, maladies, cookin' and bickerin' are all in a day's worth of homesteading for this Florida Cracker family. Help them prepare for a trip to town amidst a lively repartee chronicling existence on the 19th-century Florida frontier.

Recommended for Grade 2 and up; 30-45 minutes. Cost: \$250 for up to 125 students.

FIRST CONTACT: LA FLORIDA

Two worlds collide as Juan Ponce de León first sets foot in Florida in the 16th century. Students participate in the fateful introduction of European culture in Native American territory as Ponce and his Timucuan counterpart strive to communicate, connect, and cooperate.

Recommended for Grade 3 and up; 30-45 minutes. Cost: \$250 for up to 125 students.
