Content Focus – hardships of pioneer life, fun on the frontier, interaction with the Seminole Indians • 2-hour guided tour • 5 rotating stops • Courtroom mock trial • Butter and candle making workshop (take-home) • Cameo performance or puppet show

The Indigenous Shell People – Grades 2 and up *Max capacity per day: 150 students*
