Application for School Field Trip Funding, 2018-2019

Our school field trips are funded through United Arts of Central Florida. Please complete this form so that your school may be considered for funding. Title 1 schools receive priority. Funding is allocated on a first-come, first-served basis. For all field trips, groups will be divided evenly into five touring groups with a maximum of 150 students per day, with the exception of Raiders of the Lost Artifact (max 100). For more than 150, please book a second day. We offer the following types of field trips:

Highlights of the Museum – Grades K and up. *Maximum capacity per day: 150 students*

Content Focus – overview of general Florida history

- 2-hour guided tour • 5 rotating stops • Courtroom mock trial • Butter-making workshop
- Cameo performance or puppet show
- 10:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.
- Lunch space available in the park, 12:30 – 1 p.m.

Little Historians – Grades K-1. *Max capacity per day: 4 classes (up to 100 students)*

Content Focus – Then and now (pioneer life), Florida's native animals, Native Americans

- 1-hour guided tour at museum • 1 hour of guided activities and take-home craft at the Orlando Public Library
- Cameo performance or puppet show
- 10:30 a.m. – 1 p.m.
- Lunch scheduled during tour

The Pioneer Hustle – Grades 1 and up. *Max capacity per day: 150 students*

Content Focus – hardships of pioneer life, fun on the frontier, interaction with the Seminole Indians

- 2-hour guided tour • 5 rotating stops • Courtroom mock trial • Butter- and candle-making workshop (take-home) • Cameo performance or puppet show
- 10:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.
- Lunch space available in the park, 12:30 – 1 p.m.

Breaking Barriers – Grades 2 and up. *Max capacity per day: 150 students*

Content Focus – examining primary sources such as maps to better understand history, over 400 years of black history in Central Florida, Achievements in STEM and Innovation

- 2-hour guided tour • 5 rotating stops • Courtroom mock trial
- Highwaymen painting workshop (take-home) • Cameo performance
- 10:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.
- Lunch space available in the park, 12:30 – 1 p.m.

The Indigenous Shell People – Grades 2 and up. *Max capacity per day: 150 students*

Content Focus – lifeways and culture of the Seminoles and Timucua, interaction with European explorers, causes and effects of the Seminole Wars

- 2-hour guided tour • 5 rotating stops • Courtroom mock trial
- Pinch-pot pottery workshop (take-home) • Cameo performance
- 10:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.
- Lunch space available in the park, 12:30 – 1 p.m.

Raiders of the Lost Artifact – Grades 4 and up. *Max capacity per day: 100 students*

Content Focus – analyzing and examining primary sources and how historians use them to interpret history; social studies as an interdisciplinary subject (history, science, archaeology) • 2-hour guided tour

- Visit to the archive and research library to view real Central Florida artifacts and meet a museum curator • Courtroom mock trial • Archaeology dig hands-on workshop • Cameo performance
- 10:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m.
- Lunch space available in the park, 12:30 – 1 p.m.
