TIME TRAVELERS

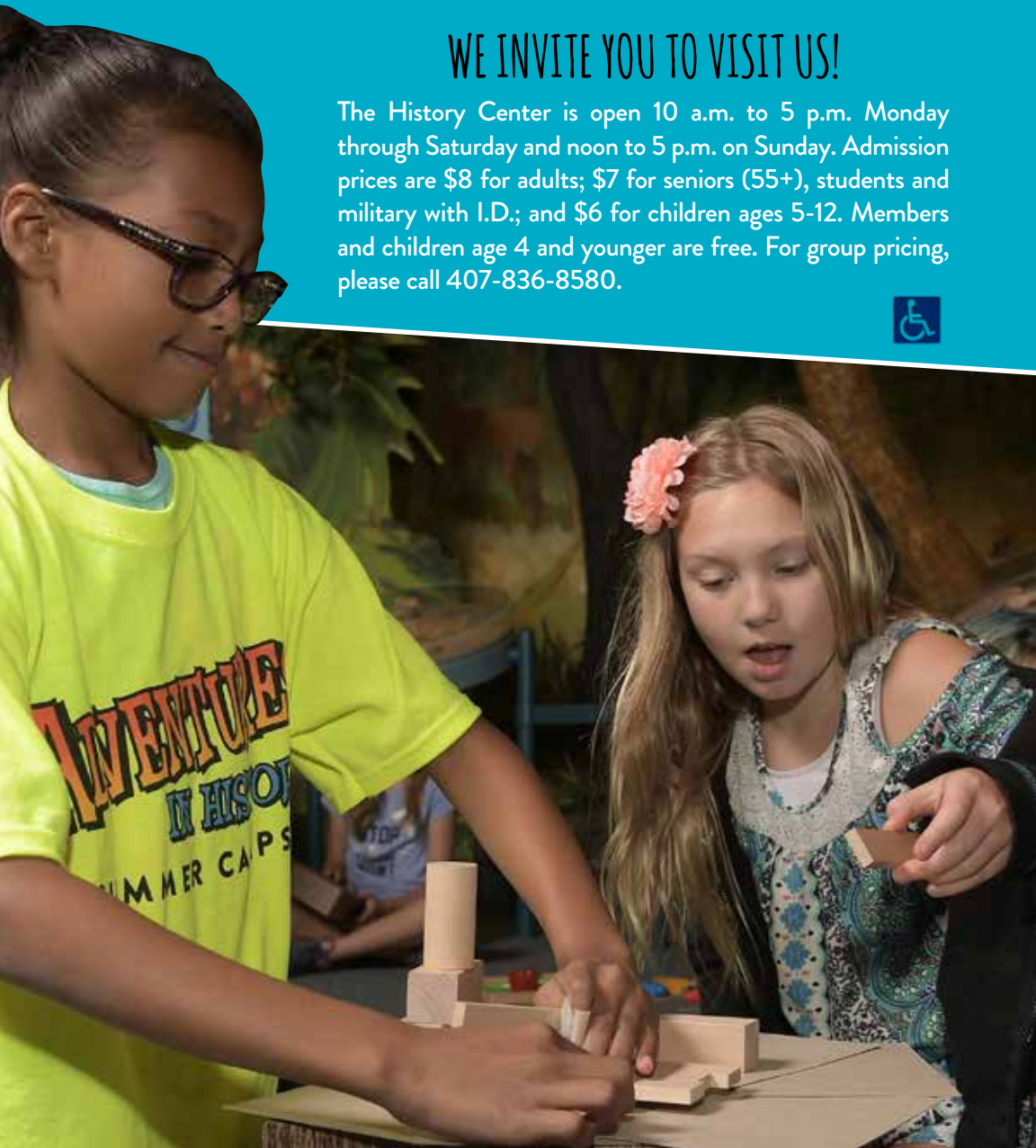
