


# GENEALOGY RESOURCES

- **1. FamilySearch.org** Make a free account at this site, and you can search millions of records and begin your own electronic family tree.
- 2. Ancestry.com This is a great site with millions of resources and really amazing family tree features, but it is \$\$\$. Family Search is a good place to start while you feel out your love of genealogy! But as we mentioned above, if you have an OCLS library card, you can use the Library Edition from home for free! After April 30, you can still go to any library branch and use this edition anytime you want it is a fantastic deal!
- **3. Newspapers.com** A sister site to Ancestry, it also has a pretty steep paywall. Before you think about using, make sure it has the papers from the locations your family members come from.
- **4. Cyndislist.com** A free website and a treasure trove of resources.
- **5. Google** Don't rule out a good Google search of your family names and dates.
- **6. Local Genealogical Societies** Wherever your family members are from, see if that town, county, or state has a genealogical society. Often, these small groups of passionate volunteers have built and transcribed great databases of information you could only otherwise get your hands on if you were traveling.




