This September at the History Center, Celebrate Latin American Arts & Culture, Revisit the Orlando Sports Stadium's Rocking Events, and More!

September at the Orange County Regional History Center brings the start of Hispanic Heritage Month and our fourth Celebration of Latin American Arts & Culture, plus a look back at the "rebels, wrestlers, and rock 'n' rollers" who made the Orlando Sports Stadium a standout in the memories of so many Central Floridians. We'll also dip into the mythical fountain of youth and the real history of the explorer Juan Ponce de León. Through our new special exhibition, we'll showcase important stories from the three decades since the pioneering media company Watermark began championing the interests of the Florida's LGBTQ+ community. As always, the History Center offers a cool place to relax and learn during a month when temperatures are often hot and skies often stormy in Central Florida.

The History Center's Jeremy Hileman looks back at the Orlando Sports Stadium, a beloved Central Florida venue that once attracted thousands to athletic events and shows of all kinds. We'll highlight its original owner, Pete Ashlock, and its ties professional wrestling and the legendary Eddie Graham, and we'll also delve into the incredible roster of musicians who performed there, including Elvis Presley, Louis Armstrong, and Led Zeppelin.

A New Exhibit – Cover Story: Celebrating Watermark's 30 Years On display August 24 – December 15, 2024

In 2024, the pioneering media company Watermark commemorates three decades of dedicated service, championing the interests of the LGBTQ+ community throughout Florida. *Cover Story: Celebrating Watermark's 30 Years* showcases memorable moments and important stories from those years. The exhibition features a retrospective of 30 of the publication's most impactful covers, which illustrate the profound journey of LGBTQ+ history over the past three decades. *Cover Story* celebrates Watermark's journey from a small paper advocating for increased visibility of diverse identities and issues into a multifaceted media company standing at the forefront of LGBTQ+ journalism in Florida.
