Lunch & Learn: Succession to Scandal – The Civil War and Lincoln's Assassination *Friday, October 3, 2025, Noon – 1 p.m.*

During the Civil War, Florida was the third state to secede from the Union in 1860. It was also home to Lewis Powell, a conspirator in the assassination plot against President Abraham Lincoln. For more than a century after Powell's execution, his body remained separated from his skull, the whereabouts of which were shrouded in mystery. Join our collections registrar, Kara Kovalev, and collections manager, Emily Coughlan, as they delve into Florida's connections to the Civil War and the mystery of Powell's death.
